Anne Watt, co-founder Primary Source

Anne Watt co-founded Primary Source in 1989. From a single workshop for teachers, Primary Source has grown into an organization that pro-vides multicultural and global educational training workshops for teachers in Massachusetts as well as providing study abroad tours. Prior to establishing Primary Source, Anne was an elementary and middle school teacher in New York, California, and Vermont. She led a federally-funded Teacher Center, worked in race relations for the Anti-Defamation League, founded an inter-racial preschool for her children, and taught graduate courses at San Bernadino State College.

Returning to Massachusetts, she put her energies into developing Primary Source's academically grounded graduate program for K-12 teacher in global and multicultural studies.

Anne received her undergraduate degree in an-thropology from Radcliffe College, master's degree from Bank Street College of Education, and EdD from UMass-Amherst.
