Photographer and educator, A. Cemal Ekin, will be the featured speaker at the Bedford Center for the Arts Photo Group's meeting from 7 to 9 p.m. on Tuesday, November 4, at the Old Town Hall, 16 South Road. Ekin will explore the field of black and white photography, including his own workflow that he calls the "ESP method of B&W Conversion".

Ekin is based in Providence, RI, and retired from Providence College as Professor Emeritus of Marketing in 2012 after 36 years of service there. He believes that teach has been an important experience in his life and has influenced how he shares what he knows about photography. Involved in photography for over 60 years, he has eclectic interests in the field, stating that "my interests range from salt and pepper shakers to architecture, from landscapes to flowers, from people to macro photography." Indicative of the range of his interests is that in 2013 his images inspired a ballet, "Orchis", which was performed at the Veterans Memorial Auditorium in Providence.

Ekin has had nine solo exhibits in three different states and issued limited and open edition folios,. HI photographs are in public and private collections in the US and abroad. In 2014, he was honored with the title of Master Member by the New England Camera Clubs Council.
