As a tenant at the St. Paul's building she employed two teachers and together they taught 3 classes of 8 children. Tuition was \$15 per month. The population and expenses grew, but her beliefs remained steady. Treat each family with respect, compassion and work together to give children a happy, caring environment for a first school experience. And...she would always say "Mothers need a break!". Jean had a wonderful wisdom and humor. She appreciated the support of parents.

I was one of the parents, having had 2 children attend, when Jean hired me to teach in 1984. I knew that Jean believed I would handle the job. In a roomful of 36 bouncy 4 year olds I sometimes had disbelief! Yet, it developed into a love affair and I stayed, agreeing to become Director in Jean's succession in 1992. When I retired in 2008 Lee Frank became the 3rd Director in charge of the legacy. All that was written, and more, is correct. Lee is a beloved, caring leader.

So, my point is this - Thank You Mrs. McCaffrey for an enduring gift. We remember.
