Ms. Emily Style, Co-Director of the SEED program at Wellesley Centers for Women, will describe that program--Seeking Educational Equity and Diversity-- during the May 4 meeting of the American Association of University Women to be held at Bedford Library's meeting room at 7:00 p.m.

Since its beginning 30 years ago, SEED has been based at Wellesley's Center for Women, and early conversations with were centered around the 1992 AAUW publication "How Schools Shortchange Girls."

SEED is described as a "peer-led professional development program that promotes change through self-reflection and interpersonal dialogue and builds capacity for more equitable curriculum, campuses, and communities."

With what SEED calls "new leaders' weeks, monthly seminars for participants are held. These participants are typically leaders from public and private schools, colleges, and communities. Plan to come and hear about this unique program.
